

## Who we are

Our collections relate to the area between the Solent Coast and the New Forest and offer insights into local and national history. The museum also holds significant collections about many of the surrounding villages and large estates. The collections and the stories that they tell reflect many aspects of life in the area, from prehistory to the present day including home life, industry, shops, trades, farming, leisure, sport, war, holidays and the local environment. One of the most recent acquisitions is the Boldre Hoard, a collection of more than 1600 third century Roman coins, unearthed in a field near Lymington.

To enhance our educational work with schools, pre-schools and families, we often use objects for handling, and are keen to acquire more.

By Road: From the east: leave the M27 at junction 2, follow A326 towards Fawley, take B3054 through Beaulieu to Lymington. From the west and north: follow A337 to Lymington town centre.

By Bus: Bluestar No 6 from Southampton. More bus X1 or X2 from Bournemouth or Christchurch.

Parking: Pay and Display in Emsworth Road, including two disabled
